Candidates will be required to:

- Ensure all compliance requirements are managed and endorsed by the School and Cadet program.
- Establish and maintain strong and collaborative relationships with key stakeholders including formal Cadet Leadership, the School (staff, students and families), and the wider Community.
- Assist with the implementation of the Outdoor Education framework.
- Manage all administrative duties and responsibilities involved in managing and deploying camps including attendance at most camps as part of the role.

Candidates must have:

- Demonstrated understanding, knowledge and experience of the Australian Defence Force (ADF) cadet program.
- Strong time management and organisational skills with the proven ability to multi-task, meet deadlines and being accountable for the performance of each area of responsibility.
- Demonstrated commitment to nurturing positive relationships with students to ensure they thrive in a team environment and become responsible members of the local community.
- A willingness to hold a Command Course qualification and an Officer in Charge qualification.

All staff at The Southport School acknowledge the Code of Conduct and should be supportive of the stated values and Christian Ethos of the School. Applicants must or be eligible to hold a current Blue Card and a current First Aid Certificate. Candidates will be required to submit their details for a national register check conducted by the Anglican Schools Professional Standards office.
